He has been organizing the International Conference of Chief Justices of the World every year for the past 24 years, inviting the highest-level Judiciary from across the globe, with the objectives of building a global consensus in favour of world unity and world peace.

Alumna of Lucknow University and former psychologist at the UP government's Psychology Bureau, Dr Bharti Gandhi is the cofounder of CMS. She continues to organise a Sunday Satsang (spiritual discourse) every week since the last 23 years at CMS. 

Learning with Fun

About 15% of the CMS student body is below the age of 6.

The school environment is engaging and responsive to the child at each stage of his/her development.

In pre-primary years, CMS aims to develop perceptual, motor, cognitive and socioemotional levels of a child, as the basis for readying him/her for school education, and for life in society.

We create a happy environment for social contact with peers, and we deliberately create opportunities for young children to explore and learn through play, dance, music, drama, art, games and sports.

We promote the development of creativity over memorization. English is taught through Fitzroy phonics, with spectacular results, with 4 and 5 year olds doing early reading. Learners get some time on computers for colouring and drawing.

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Creative Arts

To encourage creative arts such as theatre (drama) and dance from an early age, CMS provides opportunities with well-trained and experienced teachers at every campus.

In energizing dance classes, CMS students are taught various classical dances like Kathak and Bharatnatyam, folk dance, as well as western genres like hip-hop, ballet, and jazz.

Fostering Literary Passion

Recognising the importance of early reading for the development of language, vocabulary and creativity, in 2023, we introduced the CMS FREADOM Reading App which has vastly increased primary students' interest in reading stories.

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Experiential Learning

The CMS primary curriculum is based on active learning rather than on passive relay of information by a teacher. Experiential learning offers in-depth study, giving the learner a better understanding of the concepts and also a handle on the application of the knowledge in the real world around them.

Through project based learning in classes 4 and 5, and the integration of HOTS (Higher Order Thinking Skills) questions in assessments/tests, CMS seeks to develop in primary age children:

- Critical thinking
- Creativity
- Problem solving skills
- Communication
- Collaboration

Assessment for Learning

Assessments drive the class-room pedagogy of the teacher. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP 2020), CMS has moved away from conventional patterns of assessment which focused on testing memorised facts and knowledge, towards testing of skills such as critical thinking, application, analysis and problem solving.

We have engaged a specialized assessment company - Centre for the Science of Student Learning (CSSL) to provide us robust assessments that have both validity and reliability.

Students take the test on OMR sheets, which permits us to provide them with diagnostic and personalized report cards. This enables children to improve in areas identified as weak points.



Inspiring Junior Years

The school creates a stimulating learning environment that both supports and challenges the individual student. It promotes a safe, orderly and caring environment.

We take a holistic approach to promote the acquisition of 21st century skills:

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Dance, debating, sport, indian and western music (with the option for individual music lessons), elocution, foreign language classes, public speaking, community service, and foreign visit opportunities are used to expand minds and shape young personalities.



Students aged 11-13 are emerging as junior youth and curious adolescents. The foundations of solid learning laid here set the stage for academic success in the senior years.

CMS identifies key aspects occurring in transition from childhood to adulthood, which form the foundation of learning during the Junior years.



Junior Youth Empowerment Programme (JYEP)

The Junior Youth Empowerment Programme (JYEP) is an international programme adapted by CMS for the empowerment of its junior students (d. 1963).

The Virtues Project

Moral education has been a core part of the CMS philosophy on education since the very beginning, and CMS has sought to bring the most successful elements of moral education from around the world to its students. In the past two years, CMS has adopted the globally acclaimed Virtues Project, a set of 5 strategies to be utilized in classrooms to ensure the moral development of children: speaking the language of virtues, recognizing teachable moments, honouring the spirit, companioning, and setting clear boundaries. The Virtues Project began in Canada and has found success in over 100 countries, even being endorsed by the Dalai Lama and the United Nations. CMS is the first school in Lucknow to adopt the Virtues Project and has invested in it wholeheartedly, bringing in expert trainers from the United States for ongoing training and support of teachers. Students research water, biodiversity, and methods for energy conservation. Western Classical Music

The school is committed to providing valuable performance opportunities through the successful organization of face-to-face exams by the ABRSM, involving approximately 400 students across various instruments.

Exceptional milestones include outstanding performances and distinctions, with individuals like Vrinda Goel and Bihu Singh, along with over 45 students passing ABRSM grades with Merit marks, showcasing the dedication of both students and instructors.

A significant collaboration with ABRSM India and the Vienna Conservatory allowed Western Vocal trainers and music teachers to gain a unique experience in Austria, participating in the Vienna University's Philharmonic Orchestra and Choir. The school also hosted an impressive Western classical concert, featuring more than 300 musicians from 27 nationalities that included the symphonic orchestra and choir of Vienna University, and CMS students and teachers.

Continuous learning is fostered through annual summer and winter music camps focused on Western classical training for both teachers and students. These camps serve as platforms for refining skills and exploring musical potential.

The school's choir consistently demonstrate improvement since the introduction of Western music education in 2017, evident in competitions such as the Christmas Tide choir competition at the Rajajipuram Campus I.

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
Creating opportunities








High Academic Standards





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Infrastructure & Resources

Robotics Labs

The Robotics laboratories at CMS Rajajipuram I, Gomti Nagar I and Gomti Nagar II, started with the aid of Bangalore-based tech firm Serena Technologies, to introduce students to Robotics and cutting-edge technologies such as 3D Printing with a very practical approach, relevant to all ages.

Students work with 'Nino' the humanoid robot, which can be programmed in many different ways.

Device-Based & Adaptive Learning

CMS has started providing devices such as tablets and stateof-the-art computers for learning. 'Adaptive learning, is being trialled in a variety of pilot projects to personalise learning to the needs of individual students by pitching specific learning content to each student according to his or her own level of understanding and pace of learning. At the same time, meaningful data is automatically aggregated for teachers to use to inform their teaching strategies. This is enabled through continuous diagnostic assessment through the eLearning platform, combined with sophisticated algorithms and data analysis through machine learning and artificial intelligence. Some of these pilot projects include tablet-based mathematics adaptive learning software Khan Academy having online content, Tata ClassEdge and other artificially intelligent eLearning platforms.

Interactive White Boards & Flat Panels

CMS has installed more than 1526 interactive white boards across its classrooms a total across CMS – to enhance the classroom teaching process. In addition more than 350 interactive flat panels have recently been purchased in the CMS quest to remain abreast with cutting edge technology, to further optimise children's learning experience and to make technological adoption easier for teachers. Our interactive boards are equipped with Tata ClassEdge content – quality, interactive learning content mapped to the children's curriculum. Our LED screens and sound systems support events for children in our state-of-the-art auditoria and across CMS campuses.



Secondly, students of classes 8 to 11 attend the plenary and parallel sessions of the conference, where they get a four-hour opportunity to hear the speakers, offer their perspectives on the conference themes, and ask the assembled senior world judiciary their searching, complex and sometimes discomfiting questions.

The enormity of the opportunity and the positive impact of such participation is incalculable, even though it is not immediately visible. Since students are intellectually engaged in discussion of contemporary world affairs in the presence of eminent international dignitaries and legal luminaries, they wish that their perspectives are valued, and they become aware of the importance of their concerns in the world, which boosts their self-worth, self-concept and confidence. That the opportunity is priceless is attested by discerning parents and students alike, not least because it makes children's vision world-embracing.


